FOUNDER OF THE PRICKLY PEAR

INTERVIEW BY JENNIFER DUFEK



Tattle Magazine: How important was it to you to have your line made from natural inaredients?

Mona Bahraini: About in my mid-20s, I went through this deep dive of what am I putting on my skin and in my body. I got this perpetual rash on my eyelid every so often from my mascara. I went through this huge process of elimination with my makeup. It fueled and planted the seed of me going through this whole discovery of using natural ingredients. Then I went through my hair and skin care and I was like... what is on the back of these ingredients? You can't understand it. How is this normal? I started understanding what I am putting on my body. And I just tested things out and it came down to oils. I noticed that coconut oil and jojoba oil were in everything. And I thought... why don't I just try using that oil? And that's how I discovered using oils and I had been using those for a long time. And then since I use prickly pear for everything... I looked into prickly pear seed oil.

TM: What is your favorite product that you carry of your own line and

MB: I am such a small fish in the biggest pond that ever has existed. First of all, I'm all about minimal ingredients and minimal products. You do not need a five-step routine every day to take care of your skin. My facial oils are just that. They replace all products. You don't have to use toners or creams after this product. You just wash your face with water you apply the night oil. You wash your face with water in the morning and you apply the morning oil. So it's really a toss between the morning and the night oil because that's all you need. You can get rid of all other products. It makes it very simple.

TM: Do you have any plans for future products?

MB: Honestly, no, I'm at this point where my goal is to completely disrupt the skin industry with the concept of doing less. You don't need multiple products.

I feel like everything's a gimmick now and my oils... they're so simple. It's a one-product kind of thing and it lasts for months. You get to save money. You're using a hundred percent pure ingredients and I just think it's unnecessary to think about extra products in the future. I just want to help people out and eliminate chemicals from their lives... makina their lives easier and affordable using natural ingredients.

TM: I saw on your website that it mentions you have a nursery with a purpose... a community garden. I love that! Can you tell us about that?

MB: Yeah, it's really hard to say where I grew such a special place in my heart for adults with developmental disabilities.

From a young age, I had a cousin who had some mental disabilities and I was very close to him. Whenever we went to family reunions nobody talked to him much, but I would and I just enjoyed the pure aspect of his soul and his personality.

Ever since then, I've always been very involved with community gardens, specifically with adults with disabilities, because once you turn about 21 or 22, there's like zero programs... and the families are always trying to find things to do. I've always just been involved with that and I just think that gardening is therapeutic...well, it's not that I think it is it 100% is

It just takes us back full circle to the Earth... and the Earth provides all

the air we breathe... all the beauty we see. That is why when I started this, it was more about educating people, not selling a product. My goal was to connect people, everyday people, to children in underserved neighborhoods and adults with disability groups.

So at The Prickly Pear, we'd have kid programs and adults with disability programs come here, and they would grow seasonal vegetables and things like that three to four times a month. Then once or twice a year, I would have a tiny farmer's market during our public hours and our customers would buy from the people who grew the garden and things in the garden. It was really fun!

The risk of adding in transportation is the biggest problem. So I talked to those programs, but the transportation is still picking up the pieces and figuring things out. We hope to start that back up soon. We did it for about three and a half years.

TM: Do you have a favorite quote or saying?

MB: I do! It's by Angela David... "You have to act as if it were possible to radically transform the world. And you have to do it all the time."... That's my favorite quote because I just genuinely think... you know... people think like... this plant lady just started a skincare line in 2021 but it was because I wanted... I believe in changing the skin industry and I want to help people so badly.

My skincare products aren't for everyone. I think there's plenty of room for natural skincare lines. And I just hope to help shape the skincare industry specifically or help reshape it... you know... to change the way people look at their skin.

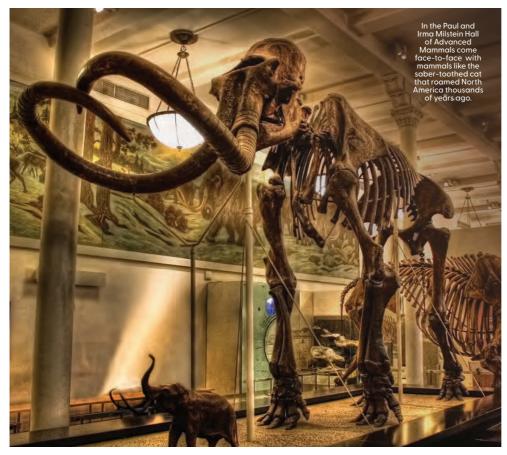


CELEBRATE CHINESE NEW YEARS IN CHINATOWN

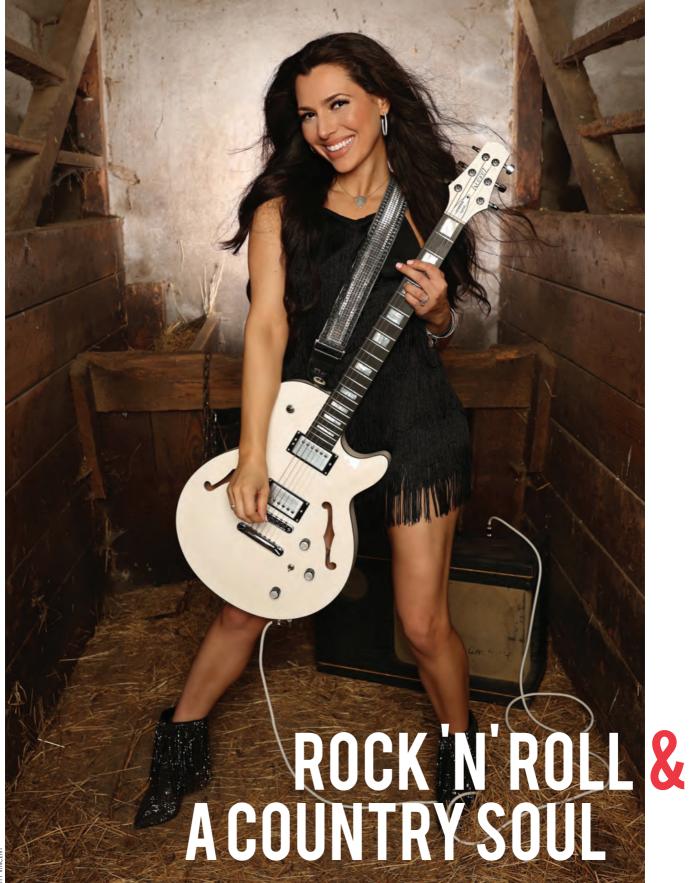

New York-based country crossover Jessica Lynn aoes behind the scenes of her music special, 'Very Merry Country Christmas', on the road with family and shares the secret to a wonderful life... Always be yourself.

Tattle Magazine: Let's start with your music career... tell us a little bit about that... is music something you have always been interested in?

Jessica Lynn: Yeah, so ever since I was a little kid music was always just what I wanted to do. I started writing songs when I was about three years old... my parents have been used to me putting on my shows in the living room for them and my family. Then I started my first band when I was 13 and started professionally gigging... and so it's been many, many years of this dream and it's cool that so many things that I had envisioned when I was younger have come true.

TM: Have you always been drawn to country music?

JL: No... so I grew up as a New Yorker... an Italian New Yorker, born in Brooklyn. So, it's not that common, however in my high school band... it was rock and roll.

It was very much like a No Doubt type of style... and I love everything... I mean if you go through my Spotify right now it goes from punk rock to Neil Diamond... to Barry Manilow... to the Beach Boys... it's really all over the map. My musical taste was always that way, but my dad, despite being an Italian New York street cop loved country music. I always had



country music on in the house, and every car ride was George Strait. My earliest memory of country music ever was Glen Campbell's Rhinestone Cowboy which would play over and over again in the house. I really learned to love it and have an appreciation for it as I grew a little bit older and started seriously writing music because the stories in country music... especially the older country music are unlike anything else. Then I started playing country when I was about 19 or 20 years

TM: You're also very talented instrumentally.

JL: Yeah... so when I was a kid and I started that high school band, I was writing all the music, and I was classically trained on the piano. That's my first instrument. However, kids are kids and I would

lose the guitarist in the band and then I would have to be showing the drummer this or that or replacing the drummer because they didn't have the same adult mentality that I had when it came to music. I was very frustrated. I wanted to be able to show them... 'play this'... like this is what I'm hearing in my head. So that's what ultimately led me to learn all these different instruments... to be able to communicate and structure my music the way that I wanted it to be.

TM: How many different instruments can you play?

JL: I play piano. I started on bass before I went to guitar, but it's been many years. I played the violin when I was younger. I play a little bit of harmonica, drums, guitar... a little bit of everything.

I also volunteered at an animal shelter once a week, and at a farm once a week, taking care of the animals.

I've been a big supporter of the military and our troops. For my second PBS television special, we gave ticket sales to an organization that sends care packages overseas.

Recently I've gotten even more involved in the animal community because, during the pandemic, I adopted a disabled rescue dog. She had both of her back legs severed and was left to die in an abandoned house. So she has two prosthetic legs and a wheelchair. It took us three years to heal her with many surgeries. Now, she's running, playing, and healthy like a regular dog. I got heavily involved in the

that I work with, probably the most out of any of these days, is Joey's Paw. They are an organization that helps put dogs in prosthetic leas and wheelchairs.

TM: That's wonderful! There are so many rescue dogs that have so much love to give. What is your dog's name?

JL: They do. Her name is Audrey. She really does know that she was saved. I mean, she is the most grateful... she's my best friend. I mean, she comes everywhere with us. She comes on tour. She's the tour manager, we say. She changed my life in so many ways... showing me that horrible things can happen and you can come back and be resilient. She's just amazing.

TM: I think we underestimate the impact that animals... pets have on our... in our lives and on our hearts... their ability to

JL: It's so true... I know it's kind of a cheesy rescue saying, but like who saved who? When I got her, it was a very hard year... the pandemic was hard for everybody. For musicians though... in 2020 I had a hundred cities... 14

country tour booked. We were at the top of our game. I was playing... I had gotten off the road with ZZ Top, Richard Marx and Loretta Lynn... all these amazing things are happening for the band. I got the rug pulled out from under me, you know, in an artistic career you can't just call your boss and be like, what's next? When do we come back to work? You know... it doesn't work that way and it was devastating for me. I lost everything. We had no income. My whole family is in the band. My dad's the bass guitarist. My husband's the lead quitarist. My mom sings background vocals. Not only did I lose everything, but my entire family lost everything. It was a very dark time and scary time... then along came little Audrey and brought the light back into everything.

TM: That's amazing...

JL: It was meant to be. I always say that with her injuries, nobody other than my husband and I, or a musician, could have saved her because she required so much care. She had been in multiple foster homes before us that

couldn't keep her because of the injuries. We didn't leave our house... sometimes for weeks at a time, because with foot injuries like she had, she couldn't stand at all... she couldn't be unattended even for a single moment. Anyone who had any other type of job and went back to work sooner than we did wouldn't have been able to give her the time she needed. It was so meant to be that we found each other.

TM: A blessing for both of you... You mentioned your mother, father, and husband are in the band together with vou... How does that feel to be able to travel with family?

JL: It's amazing and I think it brings camaraderie and connection on stage that is very special and unique from other bands. Not only do I have my family, but the rest of the band has been with me for a very long time. We spend holidays together... we live together for months at a time... we just have this special thing between all of us and I think people feel that when they come to our shows.



different energy to the stage...

I can describe it... is that when you're driving in your car and you see the most beautiful sunset and you try to take a picture of it, it just never looks good in the picture. That is the perfect metaphor because you have to just be there.

TM: You recently celebrated another year of your Very **Merry Country Christmas** music special. Can you tell us about that? How long have you been doing that for?

JL: Yeah, so 2023 was year seven of a Very Merry Country Christmas.

It started with funny stories. At the beginning of my career... so this was like 2014 or 2015... I got asked to open a John Denver tribute Christmas concert acoustic. So I was like, oh, we've never played Christmas before... let's trv it. Hove Christmas music! And that's always been my gift and my curse that I think very, very big.

About two years later I decided to try my own... I always had these big dreams for the show. In the beginning, it was like 80% my music and 20% the Christmas classics We had like a few dancers join us on stage and a few decorations. Then the next year I had more decorations... I got snow machines and I had more dancers... and this and that... fast forward to today... It truly is a Broadway-caliber show that many attend... it's been incredible to see the show's growth. It sells out

of the entire season. It's just transformed and now we're taking it on national tours.

TM: When you say national tour, is this the first year? I saw you had other locations, outside of New York... have been doing that, or are you just adding locations to the show every year?

JL: This show is a huge undertaking and planning... the other thing that makes it so special is that I use different dancers, choirs, singers and musicians in each city for a layer of that particular location.

TM: That's a lot of planning...

JL: Yes. This past year in the tour, there were over 1,400 kids and over 50 organizations. We partner with the Toys for Tots in that state in each place. So this past holiday season was my first year trying it, and I had no idea how it would be possible to bring a show of this scale on the road.

I mean, there's so many special effects and props and sets and things like that that go into it. So we started with only adding two dates as a test, and they went amazing. So we then went from three shows to nine this winter. And next year, we'll expand further.

TM: Are there any upcoming tours?

JL: Yes! We're planning a lot of new music right now, so we've also been in the studio recording on top of everything, and we have a lot of offers coming in for around the world this upcoming year, so we're right now just kind of in the planning stages of everything.

TM: Have you toured internationally?

JL: Yes! I've toured 14 countries so far

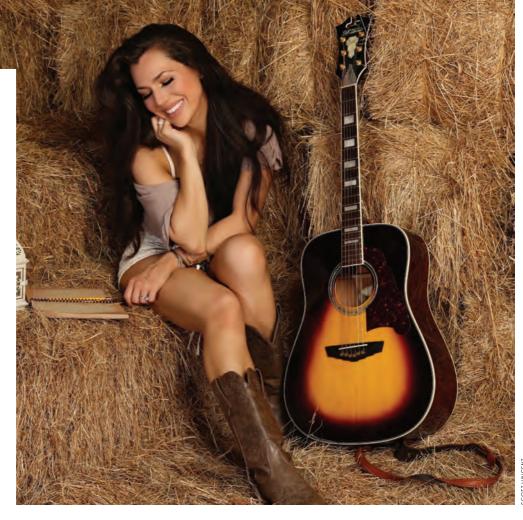
TM: That has to be exciting to be able to tour different countries.

JL: It is, especially eating all the food... that's the best part... and just meeting people. I mean, it's amazing to get to experience culture in all these places and just how people do things and get to see the sights and the atmosphere of each place. It's really incredible. I'm incredibly blessed.

TM: You mentioned your favorite quote is 'Always be yourself.' - I love that... I think you can't go wrong with that... it's so easy to get caught up in the competition and trying to be somebody else...

JL: Yeah, it's so true... I work with the U.S. government actually and I teach music mentorship classes to students around the globe and through the Department of State. I teach them basically how to create their own profitable and successful careers in the arts. I've had students from age 16 to age 50 in countries like Kazakhstan and Botswana... really all over... and it's been an amazing journey and that's what I always tell them – Always be yourself.

There are so many other people... there's only one of you. That's what will make people gravitate towards you and it's what makes you special.



TM: Absolutely... What drew you to teaching? And how did you transition from that to a music career?

JL: I have a master's degree in special education... So when I was in my high school band I saw how difficult having a music career was. We were very close to a big record deal... I was about 16 along with the other kids in the band and unfortunately, again we were just kids... it didn't wind up working out and it devastated me. My parents urged me to go to college for something that could be a backup plan. I had no intention of using it unless I wanted to not live this life anymore. I knew I was going to study, graduate and then continue doing what I was doing. Throughout school, I was gigging several nights a week. I filmed my

first television special while I was student teaching. I was out all night in studios and filming and then waking up at 5 am to go to school. I would always substitute teach... I haven't gone in for several years because we've been so busy since everything since it's taken off.

TM: Sounds like you love working with children...

JL: I do! I love working with kids... I think they're just amazing. They inspire you just as much as you can inspire them... especially working with children with disabilities. It

touched my life and made me so patient and understanding of other people and never judge a book by its cover.

I'm grateful for all those experiences because they molded me into a very compassionate person... I was then working with the government as an artist being an official cultural ambassador for the U.S... they were like, "Hey, you have this master's degree... would you maybe be interested in sharing this knowledge?" I thought sure, why not? I even tauaht courses from the road while I was on tour.

Tattle Magazine: Can you tell us about orca family dynamics?

Sam Wallace: Yeah, so it's not, it's super complicated, because you got to understand that when it comes to the species of killer whales... orcas, every region has its own, different group. They are often genetically distinct from each other. They eat different things. They speak a different dialect of their language, they don't understand each other, they don't breed with each other, and that also affects their family dynamics.

Here in the Pacific
Northwest, where I am, there
are two main ecotypes, is
what they're called... what
the genetic groups are
called. We have the West
Coast Transients, which are
also known as Bigg's killer
whales, and we have the
Southern Resident
killer whale.

The Bigg's killer whales are exclusively mammal hunters, so they're hunting seals, sea lions, dolphins, and other larger whales. And because they are hunting larger prey, they tend to live in really immediate family groups. It is always led by mom... or grandma in some cases... and then it's all of her kids. Let's say we have a family of

four killer whales, there are two males and two females. One of those females is mom, and the other three are kids... they're siblings, all born from that lead female. So, she's in charge and decides where to go, what to eat, when to eat, when to sleep... when the youngest ones are allowed to play... when playtime's over... she makes all the decisions for the pod.

That's kind of the general family dynamic of the Transients. When it comes to Southern residents, it's the same, but it is so vastly different. The Southern Residents are made up of three main pods – there's the J Pod, K Pod, and L Pod.

Each pod has several different matrilines, which is one mom and her calves, and they all tend to travel together. J Pod is currently about four, maybe five different matrilines right now. They do have a lead female. I don't know who is currently leading the J Pod right now. J Pod as a group has been having a really big family dynamic thing going on since their matriarch passed away six years ago.

They're doing their own thing, but when it comes to the Southern Residents, they're almost always together in one group. You almost always see all 25 members of J Pod together. It's a lead matriarch amongst all the matriarchs. Then that lead matriarch decides where to go, what to do, when to play,

Pod of Transients off San Juan Islands and when to eat for the whole pod... but one of the matrilines can leave and go off and do their own thing for however long they want to do it.

TM: You mentioned that there were different dialects and groups don't necessarily understand each other...

SW: It's a language barrier.... but then within each population, there are accents. So, like America has the English language and like 50 different accents of it. I have a Midwestern accent, you know, you go down to Florida, it's a Southern accent... J Pod has a different accent from K Pod. which has a different accent from L Pod. They can all understand each other, but they cannot understand the Transients. That's a whole different language.

TM: So, they don't leave their actual groups... or do any of them leave to create a new group?

SW: When it comes to the Southern Residents. they will breed with each other's pods. The Southern Residents are actually a bit of a unique example because they are an endangered group. There are officially 75 remaining, unofficially there are 74. There is one male from K Pod who is currently MIA. We don't know where he is. We haven't seen him since August. He's likely dead. So members from K Pod, if they were to meet up with members from J Pod and they had, in each pod a receptive male or female... mating very well can happen. Mating can also happen within the same pod because they're not all directly related to each other. They're all genetically close to each other but they're not always directly the same.

We could have J27, his name is Blackberry... he could mate with a female from J Pod if she's receptive and willing to mate with him.

Then there are also cases with the Southern Residents where we do have direct inbreeding going on. There is a younger 26-year-old male named Mike... his first calf that he fathered is also his sister. He mated with his mother, which is one of the only times we've ever actually seen that happening. That is due to the Southern Residents having a very small group of receptive individuals that are capable of mating right now. When it comes to the Transients, as far as we know, there isn't any inbreeding going on because it's one family... with one family... with one family.

You don't often see three or four different families traveling together for a consistent amount of time. You'll see them come together for maybe a couple of days... maybe a week and then they separate again and do their own thing.

TM: What is the underlying reason behind the strong bond observed among orcas? Is it an innate trait they've always possessed? Or does it stem from specific factors such as survival instincts or environmental conditions?

SW: My best guess with my knowledge of evolutionary history and just their overall behaviors, is they travel together because cetaceans as a group are incredibly social animals.

Once they went to a fully obligate aquatic lifestyle around 30 million years ago, they started relying on communication over distance. And then as we started to get to the more modern forms of cetaceans... dolphins, sperm whales, baleen whale... their whole lifestyle evolved around communication, the ability to find food, and what type of food they were hunting.

Modern killer whales started off as fish eaters... And as the baleen whales started to get bigger in size and

became more migratory, they started to branch out to also hunting those larger whales. And if you're a 30-foot killer whale and you want to hunt a 50-foot humpback whale that is not only bigger than you, but is about eight times heavier than you... you're going to need help. And dolphins, as a group, are by nature incredibly social animals. There are a couple of species that tend to be a little bit more solitary, but since orcas are dolphins, and they are part of the oceanic dolphin family, which are almost all incredibly family-oriented and socially oriented... it's just kind of a behavior that they were able to mold into their lifestyle of hunting and surviving. Now it's kind of required for them to interact with other members of their species to survive.

TM: You mentioned a few specific orcas and their names or the letter and number combo that they are given, how do they get tracked to know who's who?

SW: Yeah, it's all visual. So, my job outside of social media and content is I'm a whale watcher. I get paid to watch whales and to teach people about them. I'm the tour guide on the boat. And the researchers, like the Center for Whale Research... Orca Conservancy... all of those guys, they used to do actual like tagging and tracking. They've since stopped tracking them by the tagging method... because we found out back in the 70's that you can identify killer whales through visual purposes by their dorsal fin and the saddle... that white spot behind the dorsal fin.

Every single killer whale will have a different shape to the dorsal fin. It might be really subtle from one individual to another... it might be incredibly drastic from one individual to another. They will always be a little bit different. When it comes to

the Bigg's killer whales or the Transients... they often have visible nicks and bits of their dorsal fin that are missing which makes it uber easy to identify an individual. One individual I've talked about T63 Chainsaw... he has two massive chunks missing from his dorsal fin... So the tracking doesn't happen anymore through tags and radios and things like that. it's all visual now.

When I go out and we come across the pod of orcas. I get a picture if I don't recognize the whale as soon as I see it, because there's some that I can do that with, let's just say it's an orca I've never seen before. I'll grab a picture of the dorsal fin and there is a catalog that I personally use... it's called the Canadian Technical Report of Aquatic and Fisheries from 2019... this particular report was Biggs killer whale identification, so it was all pictures of both sides of the dorsal fin. the eye patches, because the eye patches are also different from individuals to individuals... We use that to identify and quote-unquote track... but it's not like how they track sharks where they actually put a tag on the animal and it transmissions radio signal until it pops off... it's all visual

TM: That is such an interesting job... whale watching...

SW: My job... it's phenomenal. I've never had a job where I wake up every single morning and I'm excited to see what happens that day.

TM: So is the orca activity pretty active when you're out?

SW: The nice thing about where I am, the Puget Sound is known for its whale watching specifically of the Southern Resident killer whales, even though the Washington Southern Residents don't really exist anymore due to all the regulations surrounding

them because they are an endangered group.

But because of the relative isolation of the region, you know, it's a smaller area... whales do go here. The odds of finding one are pretty good. Almost all the whale-watching companies out here, mine included, all guarantee a whale every time we go out. And if you don't see one, your next trip is free. That is a very confident statement to make when it comes to something like a whale, because you're only seeing them for a few seconds at a time since their world is underwater, not at the surface. I have only had, in the two years now that I've done this, three trips that I did not see a whale.

TM: Are there any aspects of orcas that you believe are commonly misunderstood, whether they be facts about their behavior or misconceptions stemming from public perception?

SW: Absolutely because you know, you and I have been calling them orcas a lot... and doing my content every time one of my videos where I'm talking about orcas, I happen to be calling them killer whales more. Someone will inevitably say, don't call them killer whales, it's a bad name for them. People associate the name 'killer whale' with these animals just kind of indiscriminately hunting anything and everything in the oceans. The only thing that killer whale means is that the first people... the first Westerners or whomever you want to say observed these animals in the wild... they observed them killing other whales. That's the only thing that killer whale means... they are whales that kill other whales. So, there was a huge stigma back in the 1930's to 1960's where killer whale was used to demonize these animals... and that's just not the case.

These are hyper-intelligent animals; I think I read a study that they are as intelligent as the average teenage person. They are incredibly intelligent animals, with highly complex social lives and communication styles. They have such strong emotions... A whole section of their brain is dedicated to emotions that we can't even comprehend because we don't have that section of the brain.

There is no good or evil with killer whales. Even in nature, there isn't a good or evil. That is a human construct that we have created as a society of really intelligent creatures.

Another misconception is recent, I am sure you know of the killer whales in the Strait of Gibraltar that have been screwing around with rudders of sailboats and have now caused their fourth boat to sink after said counter. Those particular orcas are just doing it as a form of play. They found something that is fun for them to do and now they are just doing it. They are not doing it because they are trying to get revenge on humans or anything like that. They are just wild animals doing wild animal things.

TM: I think that is something people forget is when you come close to any type of wildlife, we're usually stepping into their environment.

SW: Yeah... Especially when it comes to ocean life... marine life... they have evolved in a world, the polar opposite of us... of the world that we evolved in and the world that we grew up in. What they grew up in is so drastically different that our mere presence in their world will affect their behavior in wavs that maybe they don't normally behave in. And it's a lot of trying to teach people that anthropomorphizing them, giving them human traits, is not the correct way to go about trying to understand them, because that's not how it works in their life

TM: In one of your videos on TikTok, you mentioned two orcas that had gotten stuck in a lake, can you tell us more about that?

SW: Yes. That was T51 Roswell and T49A2 Jude. They got stuck up in a lake by in Canada.

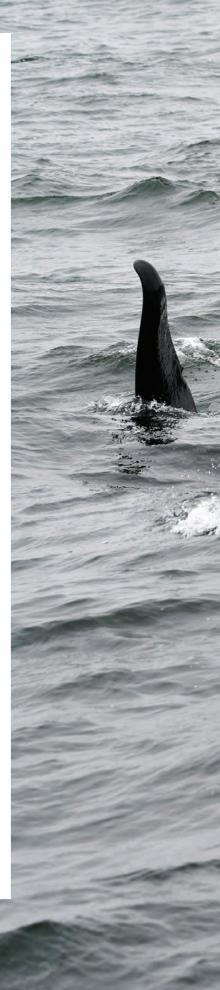
TM: Is that normal for them to go off on adventures and go exploring solo away from their pod?

SW: It's not common amongst the population, but it's consistent when you're looking at certain individuals. I have never seen one of those orcas T51 Roswell he is 45 years old, if I remember correctly... he travels by himself because his mother passed away, however long ago that she did. I don't know much about him. He's kind of more of a loner male... he'll bounce between other families that he knows, but he's often kind of by himself from what I know about him.

So Roswell's companion in that month was a teenager whose mother is still alive... so it's the T49A family. It's mom and her six kids. Her two oldest happen to be boys and both of them will often travel away from mom.

We're not entirely sure why that happens. In this particular case, Jude has been doing this a lot for the last year and a half two vears. I don't think I've seen him with his mom since I started this job. When I came out here last year, T49A had just had a birth of a new calf. Their youngest calf... we don't know the gender of it... but as soon as that calf was born within like two weeks Noah and Jude, the two oldest, left the family

Noah was one of the first whales I ever saw... he was traveling with two other pods that were traveling together as well. Jude I have not yet seen with the rest of his family. I've seen Noah with the rest of his family as he periodically comes back, but





for whatever reason Jude as a teenager at the very least is not traveling with mom. He is often seen with his uncle which is kind of interesting...

These two individuals, Roswell and Jude, went into Barnes Lake... we think they went in there to hunt seals... and that particular saltwater lake has two very narrow channels that lead you out to the ocean and it is only accessible by those channels at high tide... like once a month at high tide. So, they went in and then they couldn't

get out... and none of us outside of Orca Network... NOAA... Orca Conservancy... none of us knew that was going on because they don't want people to flock to that lake to see the two stupid boys that got stuck in the lake. They did well... apparently were feeding on the seals. They finally got them out a month later and Roswell has not been seen since as far as I know. Jude was just in my area a couple of weeks ago with another male. So, he's since left Roswell and is doing his own thing again.

TM: They have such strong personalities... showing fascinating individuality amidst their species' norms...

SW: Oh yeah, you can see that watching these guys...

I know I have talked about Jack T137A... he... his baby sister and another brother and sister from another family for a month traveled together throughout the San Juan Islands, throughout Puget Sound... while the rest of both their families were not seen for a solid couple of weeks. And like I said at the beginning of this, the females are the ones that are in charge, but when it came to this particular grouping, the oldest female was 12... And Jack is 10 years older. So what is going on here? Is Jack in charge of this little band of teenagers right now? What is happening? And I got to watch this... we called it "Jack's Summer Camp."

Amongst that little ragtag group of young whales, we could see their personality. Jack, of course, is known to be eccentric. Every time a successful hunt happens, he often goes nuts and starts jumping and breaching and having a celebratory time.

I was watching that group hunt a seal... in that particular case, Jack didn't do anything celebratory... but the youngest individual, Crinkle, she's a little 8-year-old... you could see that she was having at the time of her life... just under the surface. You could see the splashing going on after she would surface and she would go into bursts of speed... and loop around all the other whales, just kind of letting off some steam after they killed the seal.

Their personalities are so unique. And you see every aspect of them. If you see the same whales long enough, you see every little bit of their personality and how some of them are troublemakers like the two that got stuck up in the lake.

We're all concerned that Jude is going to team up with another young male, a bit younger than him, who is also known to get himself stuck. He also travels by himself away from his family. They're so fascinating.

These marine animals demonstrate strong family bonds, caring for injured members, protecting the young, and allowing mothers time to care for others. In the animal kingdom, such familial ties and community bonds strengthen populations as a whole.









Monkeys are super social creatures and hang out in gangs known as troops or tribes. The troop size fluctuates depending on the species, spanning from a just a few individuals to several hundred. Within these groups, there's a whole intricate system of who's who, with lots of ways they strengthen their bonds. One major way they do this is by grooming each other, which they call allogrooming. It's basically where they take turns picking bugs and dirt out of each other's fur, sometimes forming a whole grooming line. This grooming isn't just about hygiene—it's a way for them to build and maintain their relationships, chill out when they're stressed, and even smooth things over after a tiff.



Similar to humans, monkeys forge deep friendships and harbor intense rivalries within their social groups. They fiercely defend each other and provide care when needed. If a leader of a monkey troop is overthrown, they may display signs of depression, mirroring human emotions.



Female monkeys usually give birth to one or two offspring at a time. These newborns are born fully covered in fur and are capable of opening their eyes immediately. They also possess the ability to cling to their mother's fur, allowing them to stay close by during the initial weeks of life. Typically, mothers will carry their babies on their backs during this early stage of development.

Origins of Zebra Collective **Nouns**

INGREDIENTS

2 ½ c all-purpose flour
1 t baking soda
¼ t salt
6 oz cream cheese, softened
½ c unsalted butter, softened
1 c granulated sugar
1 large egg
1 t orange zest
½ t vanilla extract

Rolling & Filling

% c orange marmalade 1 c almonds, sliced 3 T powdered sugar

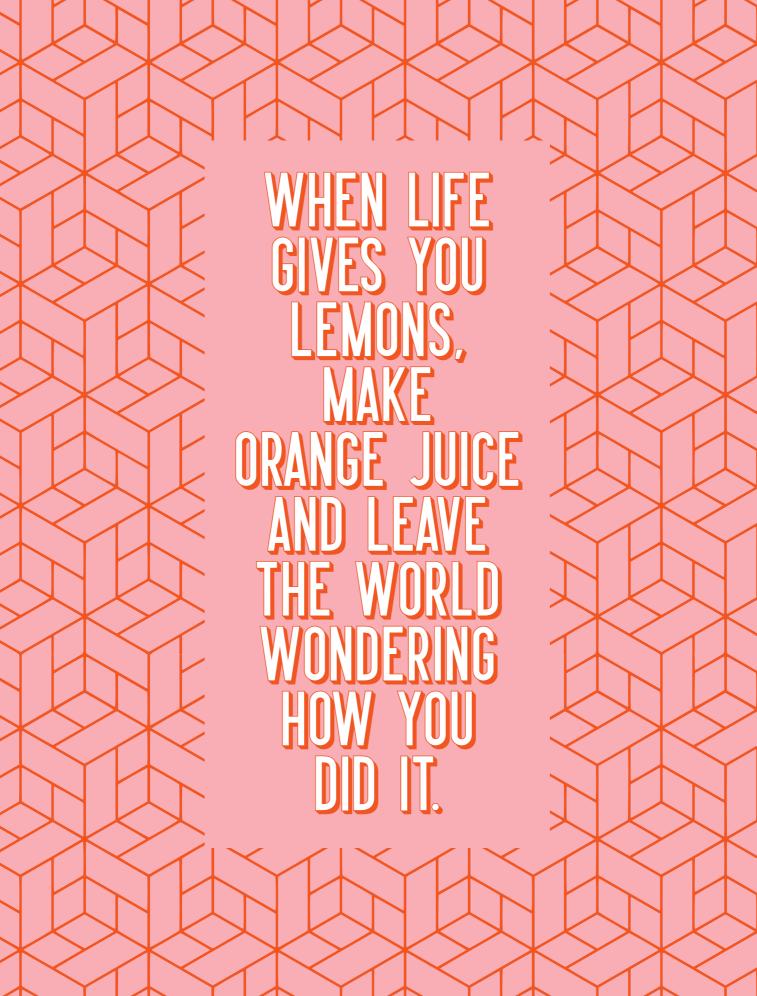
1t pure almond extract

DIRECTIONS

- 1 Add flour, baking soda and salt in a medium bowl and combine. Set aside.
- **2** In a large bowl, mix cream cheese and butter until smooth and creamy.
- **3** Add sugar, egg, zest, vanilla and almond extract and mix together.
- **4** Add flour mixture to the wet ingredients and combine well. Dough will be very sticky and soft.

- **5** Cover dough and chill in the refrigerator for 3-4 hours.
- 6 Preheat oven to 350°.
- 7 Remove dough from refrigerator and roll into balls using 1 tablespoon of dough each. If dough becomes too sticky, lightly dust your hands with flour.
- 8 Roll each ball in sliced almonds and place on a parchment lined baking sheet approximately 3 inches apart.
- **9** Make an indent in the center of each ball of dough using your thumb or a small spoon.
- **10** Spoon in a generous ½ teaspoon of orange marmalade.
- 11 Bake for 13-15 minutes or until lightly browned on the sides. The filling will set as the cookies cool.
- 12 Allow cookies to cool on the baking sheet for 4-5 minutes before moving to a cooling rack to cool completely.
- **13** Once cooled, dust cookies with powdered sugar.

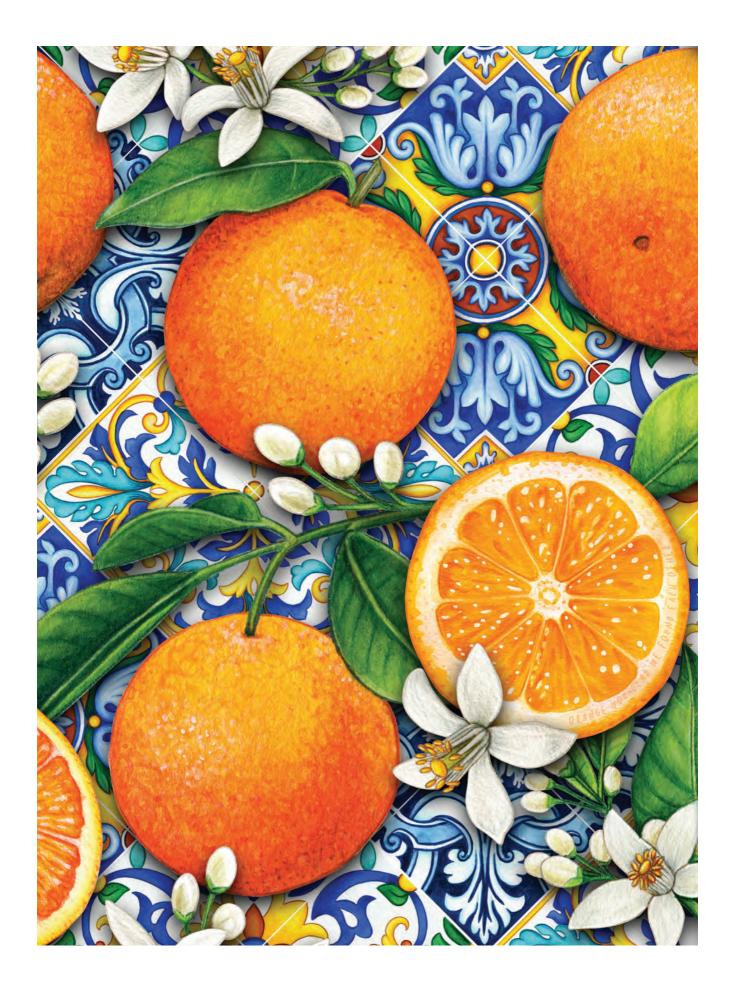

Crafting a combo of cranberry juice, orange zest, Worcestershire sauce, and a dash of hot sauce, creates a vibrant and sweet marinade for both chicken and pork.

13. Rootbeer

Similar to Dr. Pepper and cola, root beer serves as an excellent base for marinades. Just add a touch of soy sauce, and you'll elevate pork chops to a remarkable culinary delight.



Once you begin experimenting with marinades, you'll discover a world of possibilities in your culinary adventures.

14. Kiwi

Containing a potent enzyme called actinidain, this tropical fruit, possesses remarkable meat-tenderizing properties. For optimal results, marinate chicken for 15 to 20 minutes and steak for an hour. Consider blending the fruit with Worcestershire sauce and garlic before marinating for enhanced flavor. Beyond its tenderizing effects, this blend imparts a subtle sweetness and tropical flair to your dishes.



Omelet Potato Chips

We made the omelet from "The Bear" and yes, you should too!

INGREDIENTS

3 large eggs pinch of kosher salt 3 T Boursin cheese 1T+1t butter, unsalted, divided 5-6 ruffled sour cream & onion potato chips, crushed fresh chives, finely chopped black pepper, optional

DIRECTIONS

1 Place a medium or large fine-mesh strainer over a medium bowl. Crack the eggs into the strainer and beat them with a fork until the whites and yolks are uniform. Once the eggs are strained, scrape the bottom of the strainer and add any remaining egg into the bowl to minimize waste. Add salt to the eggs and whisk briefly to combine

- 2 If using a resealable bag, mix the Boursin with I teaspoon of water in a small bowl, adding up to 1 more teaspoon of water if needed, until smooth and well combined. (The goal is to thin the Boursin for proper piping.) Transfer the thinned Boursin into a quart-size resealable bag using a small spatula or spoon, pushing it about 1/4" from the bottom of the bag. Snip the corner of the bag with scissors.
- 3 In an 8" nonstick skillet over medium heat, melt 1 tablespoon of butter. Once the butter is foamy

(but not browned), add the eggs, seasoning with pepper if desired. Using a heat resistant spatula, rapidly stir the eggs with one hand while shaking the pan with the other. In 1 to 2 minutes, the eggs will resemble a soft scramble. Continue using the spatula to spread the eggs into an even layer, scraping down any excess on the sides of the pan.

- 4 Remove the pan from the heat. Pipe the thinned Boursin in a line down the center of the eggs or use a spoon to place dollops of Boursin in the center of the eggs.
- 5 Slightly tilt the skillet away from you. Starting closest to you, fold the eggs over themselves until they cover the Boursin.
- 6 Roll or slide the omelet onto a plate with the seam side down. Brush with the remaining 1 teaspoon of butter.
- 7 Garnish with chips and chives and serve.

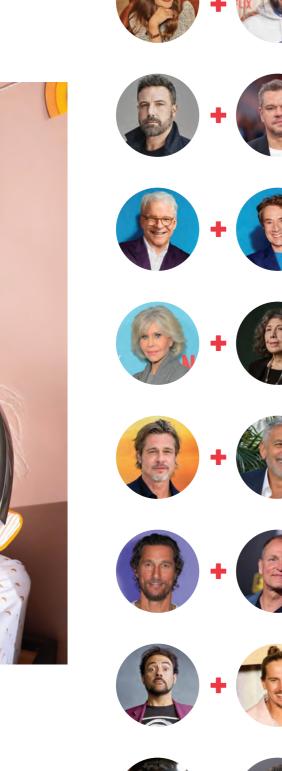

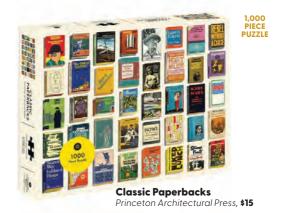

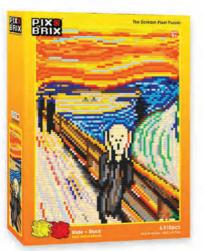

Tattle Magazine: Tell us about Little Birdie Wine Nest. How did you come to the decision to open it? Was it always a dream of yours?

Robin Keenan: Birdie's Nest is a "Social Sanctuary" for anyone who loves wine, coffee, crafting, yoga, and gathering together to make memories with friends new & old. We are located in my hometown of Parma. Ohio which is a suburb of Cleveland.

It started simply as a retail wine and tasting shop and over the last seven years has grown into a true "experiential wonderland"... where you can pop by for a signature coffee and piece of fresh locally made bakery... sip your favorite beverage while shopping our expansive retail selection of unique gifts and handmade treasures... sit down for a delicious grazing board and flight experience... enjoy wine from our 1,000 bottle selection... grab a sweet treat from our luxury chocolates and confections case... attend one of our many "sip & create" art workshops or join a yoga/group fitness class with friends.

Originally, my vision was more straightforward. I wanted to open a wine shop where people could come to learn about and explore wine, in a non-pretentious setting, where they wouldn't be overwhelmed with the usual formalities. I am a certified sommelier, and the majority of my career was spent as a beverage director for some of Cleveland's finest dining restaurants... so my passion and knowledge for wine runs deep, but I was burnt out on selling "fancy", and just wanted to be more... myself.

Sometimes the wine world can be so... stuffy! My goal was to demystify what it's all about and introduce people to the fact that's perfectly okay if you don't know all the rules, regions and foreign languages to be proficient in discussing this interesting beverage... we can learn together and have fun along the way! I wanted my customers to know that they would be welcome whether they have \$10 to spend on a bottle or \$100, and that it's perfectly fine with me if you love Sparkling Pink Moscato and drink it while eating spaghetti in your pajamas.

TM: How has your vision changed since then?

RK: My vision for my small business quickly grew, as I got to know our community members and listened to their desire for a cozy gathering space to make memories with friends. My goals shifted, in that I wanted Little Birdie to grow to one day become people's favorite spot to visit... a place that would bring friends, neighbors and communities together... that would support other local artists and makers, and industry professionals alike. I wanted Birdie's Nest to be a bright spot in someone's day... a place where everyone knows your name and you're cared for from the moment you walk in the door like family ... like a member of our "flock". We added weekly wine tastings, some seating and snacks, but to achieve this bigger vision, I realized I would need to expand our offerings to much more than just wine.

TM: Can you tell us about how you approached expanding?

RK: So, we opened Morning Owl Coffee Bar as a cozy morning spot to work, study or meet friends and extended our hours to earlier in the day. We also started hosting pop-up craft workshops like painting and string art in what has grown to be called our Crafty Canary Creativity Corner. We took the same approach to yoga and fitness as we did with wine... it's okay if you can't do a handstand... if you haven't worked out in a year and are not sure where to start... We'll take you under our wing at Balancing Flamingo and remind you that a happy life and the happiest version of you is all about finding that "balance".

From there... the creativity just kept surging and with a fantastic team behind me the offerings kept expanding... from Taylor Swift and Schitt's Creek trivia nights and Boozy Adult Game Nights where you can win designer purses... to fun and fanciful pairing parties like our signature "Brunch & Bubbly", and "Cookie Dough and Wine" events, cookie and cupcake decorating classes that were fun for the whole family and of course more formal style luxury wine dinners and charcuterie and wine educational classes. There eventually became

something for everyone of all ages, abilities and interests to enjoy in our cozy, welcoming nest.

TM: What have been some of your most popular events?

RK: One of the most unique and successful ideas we have ever had was to host a "Boozy Adult Easter Egg Hunt" on a local alpaca farm in the spring, and it's become a yearly adventure... even expanding into a BOOzy version for Halloween! Attendees would compete to find eggs, and each color would equate to a fun boozy prize like one of our wine slushies, a variety of mini liqueur bottles, cans of wine & beer, and alcohol-infused chocolates.

Right now, all things Taylor Swift are trending... so tickets to our Ultimate Taylor Swift Trivia Nights as well as custom wine bottles... soy wax candles with her lyrics and iconic imagery on them are selling like wildfire.

I think the main thing is the total experience we provide whenever you're in our nest... Lots of places nowadays offer similar events, but there's something about the atmosphere, the attention to detail, the fun and thoughtful "extras" and the friendliness of the team at Birdie that keeps our flock coming back.

It's a special sort of magic that just can't be duplicated. We are just really grateful.

TM: For adults, it can be so difficult to find people to connect with and meet new friends... starting a book or wine club or hosting a sip and paint are such great ways to bring people together, meet new ones, or just connect with someone. If someone wanted to start a small wine club or join one, do you have any advice or tips?

RK: SO true! This was the exact sentiment that we heard when we first opened the shop, and it echoed again after Covid kept us all isolated and at home for so long. So many people are working from home nowadays, and nearly anything on Earth can be purchased online and shipped straight to your door... So, we really focused on providing a reason for people to come out and experience our unique activities, connect with others and make happy



Making friends as adults is way harder than as kids, but you're totally right, attending experiential events that put you in a room with others of similar interests... and a glass of wine (or two!) to loosen everyone up... like magic; walls come down, laughter is shared, and friendships are made!

We have SO many guests over the vears who came to their first art class or trivia night alone, but made friends and grew a group that now comes together all the time!

2024 will be exciting because we will be debuting BOTH an in-person wine-tasting club AND a book club that will meet monthly, in addition to continuing to add to our Crafty Canary art workshop and Balancing Flamingo yoga calendars!

As far as someone wanting to start their own wine, book, or any kind of club... I say go for it! There are so many ways to connect on social media these days, and I see a lot of fellow moms posting in community groups about wanting to make friends and get a group together for an activity etc. I think people will be pleasantly surprised as to how many people are looking to make those same connections if they just reach out!

TM: For hosting a wine tasting? Any advice?

RK: For someone hosting an athome wine tasting of their own, my advice would be to make

sure to have a variety of wines that will compliment everyone's tastes & preferences, or go above and beyond to ask your guests what their favorite wine is so that you can maybe aet a "safe choice" bottle for them, and then have your local wine store professional recommend a varietal adjacent or similar wine that they may have never heard of to try!

For example, if they like crisp, bright Sauvignon Blancs... they'd probably like Picpoul de Pinet, but chances are they've never heard of it. If they like Rieslings, they might enjoy its spicier cousin Gewurztraminer... especially during the holidays when aromas of baking spices fill the air! Love Pinot Noir? Try Beaujolais! A loyal Cabernet Sauvignon drinker? – Introduce a Red Blend with Cabernet as the base, or try Cabernet Franc!

I would also recommend making sure that you have an assortment of snacks or small bites to enjoy alongside your wine selections. Wine truly comes alive when paired with food, and vice versa! A cheese & charcuterie grazing board is always an aesthetically beautiful and delicious choice to elevate your next wine gathering!

TM: Is there a type of wine you would suggest to someone who just wants to try a little wine tasting and is not sure where to start?

RK: The only way to learn what you like in the world of wine is to start sippin'!

That's one thing I love about Little Birdie Wine Bar - We currently have 16 wines by the alass on the winter menu that you can mix and match into

flights of four 2oz pours so you can just try a little taste and see what you like, and then maybe get a glass or a bottle to take home!

My advice if you are really unsure of where to start would be to think of fruits & foods that you love and go from there! If you enjoy citrus fruits... stay toward a Sauvignon Blanc or a Pinot Grigio. If apple, pear, vanilla, and toast sound more appealing to you... try an oaked Chardonnay. If you love red fruits like strawberries, cranberries etc... maybe go with a Pinot Noir? If you love blackberries & deep dark cherry and plum flavors... you'll probably love a heavier red like Syrah.

Everyone's palate is SO different. Just like not everyone enjoys the same

food, not everyone will like the same wine. Just because it's expensive, or highly rated doesn't mean it's necessarily for you. It's personal... and that's okay!

TM: Little Birdie Wine Nest, has a wine club with different membership levels and perks... is that for locals only? Or can anyone join?

RK: We do! Meelo's Mystery Box Wine Club (named after our pet Peach Moluccan Cockatoo "Meelo") has so many fun options, and being a part of our club does get you some pretty awesome perks including a complimentary glass of wine upon pick up, 10% off grazing boards and no corkage fees when dining in, amongst a variety of other things depending on your package!

Currently, these memberships are for pick-up only at the shop, but in 2024 we will be introducing shipping within Ohio which is really exciting! We do hope to eventually grow to be able to ship nationwide, but right now, that's just one of our big dreams!

TM: You also have an amazing assortment of seasonal charcuterie and boards... which is one of your favorites?

RK: I would almost feel like I was cheating on a boyfriend if I didn't immediately answer with "Brunch Board"... as it is single-handedly the grazing board that catapulted us to success. It deserves all the praise and mention forever, and it's certainly worthy of it!

The **Brunch Board** currently features a cozy assortment of Pearl Sugar Belgian Waffles, Strawberry Caramel Maple Syrup, Brown Sugar Candied Bacon, Lil' Pancake & Blueberry Skewers, Egg + Cheese Danish, Maple Pecan Cinnamon Roll Bites, Strawberry Yogurt Pretzels, Fresh Strawberries & Nutella, Chocolate Hazelnut & Raspberry Filled Mini Beignets, Birdie's Nest Apricot Riesling Jam and

Tattle Magazine: You picked up flag football at such a young age. So, let's start there. Why flag football?

DF: Oh, you're right. Since I started playing flag 18 years ago, it was not a well-known sport. It seemed to be a sport

for boys, a sport for men... And that's why I had to start playing with girls that were older than my age. They were 16 or 17 while I was 8. And all of that, I think, as you said, brought a lot of challenges, not only for a girl playing flag football, but for women playing sports, period.

I could say the biggest challenge for me was to be underestimated, not for any other reason, but for being a woman. I started to experience those kinds of things when I was very little, but on the other hand... I was lucky enough to have an amazing support system with my dad and mom... and also with my first coach, who always encouraged me and my team to compete against men.

I remember I was 12 or maybe even younger, like 10 years old, playing with my team and after practice, my coach would bring the men's tackle football team to play against us... because he was also a coach for them at the college level... so he would bring them

to compete against us... I feel that encouraged us to not be afraid to compete and to show what we were capable of besides what the world said at that point.... And I learned from that to focus on what I have as an athlete... as a female in sports... rather than focusing on all the challenges and obstacles.... Also, the lack of opportunities sometimes as I started growing up... there's a point in life where you must decide what you're gonna do with your life pretty much - if you're going to continue with sports or you're going to continue with your studies. Sadly... this breaking point is where most of the women just leave sports because of the lack of opportunities. For me, that breaking point was before going to college. I remember I was looking for opportunities or scholarships to be able to make my studies for the first year, but I didn't have any luck. It was after a year that I got the opportunity to have a full scholarship from Tecnológico de Monterrey where I graduated and I'm so grateful and happy for

that. Everything is changing though and the future is going to look better for the next generations.

TM: Facing some of the challenges you have and the need to break so many of those barriers in the sports industry for women that as a team... those challenges would form a special bond as teammates and a different level of support for one another... Do you feel these experiences fostered a stronger sense of togetherness among your teammates?

DF: I truly believe that's the thing that makes our team so special. That connection you're talking about that complicity was what made it possible for us to make magic on and off the field and to bring that gold medal to our country... to make that big impact together.

In our sport... in our country... I feel that we are still many times put in little boxes of what we can or cannot do... what we're allowed to do or not And every single player, not only on my team, but athletes here in Mexico... I think we have to fight against those kinds of things. We are not... we cannot still make a living from playing this sport we love – which means we have to be more than one thing. We have to be pro athletes... we have to be professionals and we have players on our team that are moms. I feel that's what I admire the most about my teammates and female athletes... not only in my country but around the globe.

TM: In light of the challenging pay scales and differing perceptions compared to men's sports, it seems that a strong passion and relentless dedication are essential for women striving to make their mark in the sports industry. How do you perceive the importance of such dedication in achieving recognition and influence as a woman in sports?

DF: Yes, you're right. It takes a different level of commitment, passion and love for the sport...

And I would say that's what has been magical about not only my team, but about flag football... and about women's sports in general... that it's a different kind of sorority, this different kind of support we have between each other because we know what we have to go through... we know what we have to fight for.

I feel that the general sentiment of women in sports right now is this vision and commitment to make a brighter future for the next girls that are coming... to give them the opportunities we didn't have... to give them the chance to make a living while doing what they love and to make the statement that they are enough – they are enough for who they are and for doing what they love.

TM: You've gotten to work with so many iconic athletes as an offensive coordinator for the AFC at the 2023 Pro **Bowl Games alonaside** Peyton Manning... and then in your very own Super Bowl commercial featuring Billie Jean King, who has been a crusader for equality in women's sports as well. What's a takeaway that you've gotten from those experiences and working with athletes like that?

DF: Well, first, the opportunity to remind the world at these big stages, how the power of sports can keep empowering women, how the power of sports can break any kind of barriers... cultural barriers... gender barriers... and send a message to the world, a message of unity... a message of love... at the end of the day that has been the thing that has impacted me the most... to see the impact it has had on many, many other people around the world.

It has also given me the opportunity to work alongside amazing people... I feel that has just inspired me more... inspired me to make a change... to be part of this movement of change... to leave a legacy, and to keep building opportunities and opening doors for the people and the women who are coming after me. It has been







a blessing to me to have them as mentors also, and to see what they have done... and just follow their paths and keep making new paths.

TM: You were a leading voice in getting flagged to be recognized as an Olympic sport, and for the year 2028, that is right around the corner, and that's such an incredible turning point for the sport and for women. Tell us how involved were you in that, and how excited you are about that.

DF: Yes, so I have had the opportunity to give back to flag football on and off the field, mostly off the field as gold ambassador for the NFL and IFAF for almost two vears now, and that has been an amazing opportunity to me. I've been able to work alongside the NFL and I have to keep growing the game not only in my country, not only in the States but around the globe to bring awareness to many other people about this sport and to build other opportunities.

The Olympic dream came true and I almost cannot believe it. I was part of that process since a year ago alongside as I said the NFL, the IFAF, the LA28 committee, and the IOC (International Olympic Committee). It took a lot of commitment and a lot of work from many, many people so I feel very grateful



TM: So, you've completed in numerous national and international tournaments representing Mexico and you've recently become the first-ever global ambassador for Los Cabos. Can you tell us about that?

DF: Yes, I feel so grateful for that opportunity to keep representing my country, not only as an athlete, but now representing an amazing place... Los Cabos... to showcase the world what our country and our culture is about... to spread that message... that message of unity that we have. To have that opportunity, it has been an honor to me, and I just feel happy for what's yet to come for not just the country, but especially for this amazing destination that has a lot to offer to the people.

TM: I've seen photos of Los Cabos... the area is just breathtaking. Is there one thing that you would tell anyone visiting that they must do or must see?

DF: Los Cabos is a very unique place because it's not only

about the amazing views you just mentioned, it is a place that really cares not only about people and bringing them the best experience, but it cares about wellness... it cares about sustainability... they care about every detail.

One of my favorite places is Flora Farms, which is an amazing restaurant, where all the food is fresh. They pretty much take it from the ground and put it on your plate. That was the first time I ever experienced really fresh food... and the experience was just... life-changing.

Also, the area is very versatile. It has the ocean and the desert. One of my favorite places is Cañón de la Zorra. You go there for amazing hiking, but then there's a hidden waterfall, right in the middle of the desert... which is crazv.

TM: It seems like nothing slowing you down. You've had so much going on... What's next?

DF: Well, on the one hand, of course, as an athlete, to keep representing my country, we have the World Cup in 2024 in

Finland. We're gonna start to get ready for that. We're looking forward to bringing another medal to the country, then at the 2025 World Games... And then the journey to 2028 Olympic Games. That's one of my biggest goals as an athlete. And on the other hand, as an ambassador of the NFL to keep growing the game worldwide through clinics and just bringing awareness to many, many regions.

And then of course to keep working alongside my partners... which as we just talked about, Los Cabos, but also Under Armour, who are committed to the same mission as mine... making a change and bringing more opportunities, especially for women in sports and on and off the field.

What I've learned is that life sometimes is crazy and amazing, and it's going to be even bigger and better than your wildest dreams. I just want to stay true to this life mission of mine and keep breaking barriers, growing the game and opportunities... especially for women.
